

Unite

Unite is an international community development project which has been developed by the Scout Association. It aims to form an active partnership between The United Kingdom Scout Association, the Uganda Scouts Association and UNICEF in order to promote development education, provide stimulating programme material for Scouts aged six to twenty and to improve the quality of life for all involved. It should also be enjoyable and fun.

Unite will help young people in this country to find out about life in Uganda, and at the same time it will help save lives in there. Scouting is a family, and our family extends to countries which are poor and in which children die or fail to develop for a variety of reasons.

This is the present situation in Uganda and Unite will help us all to find out about people's lives in Uganda, to look at some of the issues and difficulties they face and, with the help of the Uganda Scouts Association, help the Ugandan people tackle these issues and build a brighter future for themselves and their families.

Why Uganda?

Uganda is an interesting country with a very chequered past. Following the ravages of twenty years of war, the country was left poverty stricken with little infrastructure, minimal health provision and few facilities for education. In the past six years there has been relative stability in Uganda under the Government led by President Yoweri Museveni.

It takes a great deal of time and effort to rebuild a country. UNICEF, the United Nations Children's Fund, is working with the Government of Uganda to improve the education and health provision for young people. The Uganda Scouts Association also plays a very important role and that is why the United Kingdom Scout Association will be "uniting" - with both UNICEF and the Uganda Scouts Association to ensure that the country's future becomes brighter.

How can you help?

Maidstone Gang Show is very pleased to support the Unite Appeal and we would like to invite you, our patrons, to do the same. On sale in the foyer of the Theatre are special Unite badges and booklets. The badges cost 45p and every one sold will helpto raise money for the project.

The Unite booklets, whilst primarily a resource for use within Scouting, contain much interesting information about Uganda, UNICEF and the Unite project and will be of interest to any of you who are involved in education and community development.

Gang Show History

Over the years many members of the audience and Gang alike have asked how did Gang Shows start, to remedy this we include a potted history of the early days of the "Gang".

Everyone has heard of the name Ralph Reader, and his name is synonymous with that of the Gang Shows and Scout entertainment in general, however, that was not the case back in 1932. Ralph was connected with a group of Rover scouts based in Holborn, London. As he worked in the professional theatre producing production numbers for West End shows, he was a natural choice to ask if he would produce a one night show in 1932, which was performed at the London Central YMCA.

This first show was described as a "Scout Concert", the name Gang Show still had to be born. Such was the success of this trial, that it was decided to put on a second concert at the end of the year. This time there were to be a series of previews in several towns just outside London, before a three night run in the capital itself. This show was the catalyst for what you see tonight, and all the other Gang Shows that run up and down the country. Yet we still didn't have the name, in fact it wasn't until the third show that by accident a small Scout gave Ralph the idea by shouting the "the Gang's all here" during one of the rehearsals and it stuck.

The third show was backed by the then County of London to raise funds for a swimming pool, and it was under their patronage that the pre-war shows operated. Each successive year became more popular than the previous, the theatrical world was taken by storm. To keep his anonymity, Ralph used the name of "A Holborn Rover" for describing himself in the programmes, in this way he hoped to keep his professional career and colleagues in Show Biz ignorant of his new hobby. This was not to last, and as a direct result of the news breaking that the Holborn Rover was Ralph Reader, he almost became unemployed, as no theatrical producers were willing to use him due to his connection with the Gang.

1937 was a golden year for the show, with the Gang not only appearing in their very own feature film but also in their first Royal Variety Command Performance. Not bad in five years.

In the same period of time, other shows have sprung up all over the country, in large cities and small towns and villages. To give all Gangs an easy access to his material, Ralph gave the whole lot to the Scout movement free of charge, and to this day we can make use of his material, at no cost.

One of these pre-war shows took place in Maidstone in 1939, and was held in the Corn Exchange, next door to this theatre.

During the war, the Scout show went into hibernation, the Gang Show lived on under the patronage of the RAF, as it's form of concert party.

It was during the war that Ralph Reader was sent a small brown parcel containing a red Gang Show scarf which had been found on the body of a soldier killed in action. Such was the affinity of those early Gang Members, that many of them carried their scarves as mascots, and good luck tokens.

Times have changed since those early days, however, one thing remains constant, the experience of actually taking part in a Gang Show. The pride of wearing the red scarf, and the urge to do our best to entertain you, the audience. It is difficult to explain in words the atmosphere back stage, it's like nothing else on earth, and in the end it's all due to the dedication and vision of Ralph Reader and his early comrades.
