

### **GANG SHOW HISTORY**

Scout Gang Shows have existed for many years from the original idea of Ralph Reader whose shows were performed in London to the provincial shows performed in towns and cities all over the country today.

One of these provincial towns is Maidstone, which has had a Scout Gang Show since 1970. The aims of Maidstone Gang Show are to develop a sense of belonging, to encourage team spirit, increase self-confidence, to provide an atmosphere of enjoyment and fun, an introduction to stage skills and develop them further and present a positive image of scouting to the community.

Back in 1968 six scout groups from the Maidstone District approached the then District Commissioner, Clifford Vansten, who agreed that a trial show could be performed during the 1969 District AGM for one night at Oakwood park School. The show was a sell-out and well received.

In 1970 the first full Gang Show was produced by Tony Palmer, a former member of the London Gang. This was the first of many shows to be performed at Maidstone's Hazlitt Theatre. Once again the show was a great success. At this time all the material used was written by Ralph Reader but in modern times new material is being written and old ideas adapted.

In 1972 the Maidstone show continued to grow again. The producer was Tony Palmer. The early shows were performed by males only.

In 1974 and 1976 Chris Hall and Ian Craddock took the producer's mantle and for the first time female scouters became members of the gang.

1978 saw Ron Cattell, formerly of the Edinburgh Gang Show produce the show. It would be 1981 before Maidstone were to see another Gang Show. The show returned to the place of it's birth – Oakwood Park. Then began another gap until 1985 when once again the show took residence at the Hazlitt Theatre and was produced by Sue Pepper.

The 1988 show took on a more modern approach – produced by long-serving Maidstone Gang Show member, Andy Brodie. Andy Brodie went on to produce 1990, 1992, 1994 and in 1995 the 25th Anniversary Show.

In 1997 a production committee of six gang members produced the show, which brings us to the next show in 1999.

Maidstone Gang Show now has a large stock of costumes and scenery as well as a star cloth which are all available for hire. – MJC





The Heart of Kent Hospice opened in October 1991 and covers Maidstone and the surrounding area, from Borough Green to Headcorn and Yalding to Harrietsham.

The hospice provides specialist palliative care for those suffering from cancer, motor neurone disease, AIDS and other life-threatening illnesses. The aim of such care is to enable the patients to achieve the best possible quality of life and provide care and support for their families and friends.

Over the last 8 years the hospice has cared for more than 2008 patients and their families. As well as our 16 bedded Inpatient Unit and Day Care Centre caring for 20 patients 5 days a week, we are at any one time looking after the needs of up to 140 patients and their families within the community.

Hospice care is **free** but this year our running costs will be in the region of £1.3 million of which we must raise £900,000 from the local community. We are indebted to the Maidstone Gang Show for their support and care.
